
How are the Caribou doing?

On Feb 6, members of our Natural Resources department together with Elders, PhD students and biologists from Yukon Government came together for Caribou Day at the Dänojà'

The evening began with Elders Tea and discussions on maintaining good relations with Wëdzey followed by storytelling with Darcy McDiarmid, and a preview of a short film project.

Researchers in the field provided updates on environmental impacts and an overview on Caribou Management including herd size, growth, migration patterns, and harvesting on our Traditional Territory.



Heritage

Silver Berry Tree / Bush Wolf berries Dänjëk By Tr'ënin tsul (Erika Scheffen)

Two years ago I started picking silver berries with My Auntie Laura Sutherst. Together we would go to secret places in Whitehorse. Including in one of the neighbors yard (They weren't home this time....). Last summer, they were home (The neighbors house we snuck into the previous year). So my auntie went to knock on the door to ask if we could pick them and she agreed. My Auntie explained to her what they are for.

The silver berry looks silver, they have a seed in them that was used along time ago as a bead. I picked these berries on the traditional territory of Kwanlin and Ta'an. Dänojà', I am sure the Southern Tutchone people would use this item as a trade item because we definitely don't have this kind of tree/ bush in Tr'ondëk territory.

Last summer when I picked with my auntie, we drove back to Dawson in her deadly Volks Wagon vintage hippy van. We went down to mooschide. She was excited to process her seeds and worked on it on and off for 3-4 days. I didn't get a chance to work on mine while I was down in Mooschide.

I took some of my silver berries and all the juice and water from my Auntic cleaning her silver berries. And I dug a hole and planted the silver berries down in Mooschide. I am hoping to have a silver berry tree/ bush grow beside mine and my moms cabin.

It took my Auntie 3-4 days to clean off the silver berries to get the to the beautiful seed in the center, and then use a 3 pt glover needle top poke a whole through the seed. Then she used snare wire to put the seed on. I thought it was kind of funny because it took me 3 hours to clean and process 57 inches long of the seed last night. And it took her days. My fingers are a bit sore from pushing the seed down the needle. I enjoyed my learning process! And now I feel so rich with seeds around my neek.




To celebrate Mothers Day, the theme is "Nurture & Care for Every Generation"
