

In a groundbreaking discovery that captivated the world, a mummified baby woolly mammoth named Nun Cho Ga (Hän for 'big baby animal') was unearthed within Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Traditional Territory. This remarkable find, heralded as the most complete mummified mammoth in North America, holds immense significance for the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in and their cultural heritage.

Recognizing the importance of this discovery and future findings, the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in established a committee composed of esteemed Elders: John Flynn, Kris Janus, Clara Van Bibber, Victor Henry, and Patti Sidney, appointed by the Elders Council to guide the community in managing these treasures with our own laws and traditions. Through visionary sessions rooted in storytelling, the committee aims to shape the approach to working with external governments and research groups while maintaining control over all aspects of these discoveries.

Heritage

They will guide you through the information gathered and process of protecting Nun Cho Ga so far. We will we develop a vision together and define a plan for the future preservation of Nun Cho Ga. Dinner will be included at 6pm to end the evening.




Seeking Traditional Healers

Arts

On Thursday, November 9th, a group gathered to unveil a new art piece by Darcy McDiarmid at the Dänojà Zho Cultural Centre, along with an animation in collaboration with artist Chantal Rousseau. These pieces were commissioned to commemorate the Land Research Confluence, held at the Äłät Nëhëjël (TH Community Hall) on August 3rd, 2023.

This event was co-organized, co-hosted, and co-supported by Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in, the Canadian Forest Service, Wildlife Conservation Society, Yukon University, and the University of Alberta, and motivated by the organizers' commitment to Truth and Reconciliation in partnership. Co--organizers of the Land Resources Confluence, Aidan Sheppard & Emma Tom Tom, said the following:

"From the beginning, we sought to acknowledge and uphold the Truth we have heard from community for decades and to this day; that research in Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Traditional Territory has often been undertaken with a lack of respect and reciprocity. The consequence being that much of the research is created without community priorities, values, and futures in mind. This has caused real harm in community and distrust for researchers and institutions.

Motivated by the need for researchers to be present, listen, learn, and share with community, we gathered as equals to nurture dialogue and relationships between researchers and community, to help ensure that community is informed on the research happening in their home, that community priorities and values might be reflected in future research, and that reciprocal benefits can be acknowledged and realized through collaboration.

This new art piece embodies our partnership. It will be donated to the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Natural Resources Department where it will be put on display along with an artist statement.
