TH Council is seeking to nominate citizens to serve as representatives on the DDRRC. We are currently seeking one alternate member serving until October 13th, 2024. The DDRRC is a voice for local community members in managing renewable resources, such as fish, wildlife, habitat, and forestry maters, specific to the TH Traditional Territory. DDRRC members must have resided in the TH TT for at least one year immediately prior to their appointment and should have long term familiarity with renewable resources in the TH TT. Acting as a member of this Council requires the following commitments:

- Term: ending October 13th, 2024
- · Meetings: ~2hrs twice a month as needed
- Honoraria: Members receive \$50/hr for their participation
- · Mileage: Reimbursement for members who reside outside of the municipality
- · Meal: Dinner is provided with meetings



Mähsį to our entire K-12 team and our Aboriginal HeadStart team for all your hard work and preparations for the coming year. Our students and their families are so fortunate to have such a dedicated and enthusiastic and supportive team holding them up as they get back to class. You are all integral to our kids and their well-being. I know that our kids find success because of your efforts – especially those that focus on empowering them to grow and develop in ways that emphasize who they are and how they will contribute to our community.

Human development [is] learning about your place in this world – finding out who you are, including who you are in relation to the world, discovering the gifts you have, developing those gifts to make your contribution in this world, and assuming the responsibility for the use of those gifts. This view of life speaks to the purpose of learning for all children. If a young person grows up not knowing who they are, how will they know what knowledge to seek, what talents to develop, and the responsibilities of those talents? How will they come to understand that their talents and strengths carry with them an obligation to use them to make a positive contribution to the society in which they live? Education: A Dene Perspective

From Dene Kede, Northwest Territories Education, Culture, and Employment, 1993

Children are Our Future: As children build Dene knowledge, skills, and perspectives they become the community and the community is the future of our people. Our children are our future.

Children are Born with Integrity: Children are born as themselves; our job is to recognize the integrity of their inherent identity and guide them in becoming who they are meant to be.

Each Child is Unique: All children are born unique. Our job is to provide experiences that will enable a child to become who they are meant to be. Trust in Our Children: Belief in the integrity of the child leads to a respect for the child and a trust that they will rise to the challenge and learn what they need to learn; they will challenge and motivate themselves in safe spaces. Education is Survival: Education consists of providing the knowledge, skills, and perspectives that enable survival on any path that a child may choose – in the community, on the land, or in the many career options available today. Learning Comes from Experience: Education is not the same as schooling; learning happens everywhere, all the time, and through the lived experiences of each child; it is not abstract or set apart from daily life. Learning is Cyclical: Learning occurs in cycles through repeated exposure to experiences and knowledge and with increasing sophistication; this allows children to learn at their own pace "when the time is right"; children constantly learn as they live.

Desire to Learn Comes from Within: Dene learning is rooted in reality and lived experiences; children understand why they are learning the things they are learning because they see Dene knowledge in action everyday; this is fundamental to self-motivation; they own their learning because they immediately see its value.

The community is responsible for providing the experiences that will enable the child to become who they are meant to be.


