

The Adult Learning and Employment area of the Education Department has undergone an expansion over the past 6 months to enable increased programming and supports to be offered to citizens.


The TH Summer Student Jobs program saw a lot of success this year due to this extra capacity. Over 20 youth were hired to gain skills and experience in a variety of areas, including agriculture, maintenance, early learning, event-planning, health and wellness and heritage. Becky dedicated her time to ensuring the success of the program through resume-writing, organizing rides, coordinating weekly training workshops, ongoing youth and supervisor support, and throwing a fantastic year-end taco and sundae party!

Additionally, 12 citizens obtained new mentorship opportunities through the TH Internship, Trainee and Adult Job Creation programs over the past 8 months. These positions equip citizens with on-the-job experience and knowledge in order to promote future employment within TH.

Our Post-Secondary Education and Training program continues to thrive with between 70-100 students receiving funding each year to attend certificate, diploma, trades, degree, masters and doctorate programs. Natalja coordinates all aspects of funding and assists with a variety of challenges students face. She also manages our short-term training fund for citizens requiring short courses and approves approximately 120 applications each year.

Our team has been prioritizing ways to help our post-secondary students succeed. We have recently implemented higher living allowances, increased tutoring support, laptop allowances, care packages and graduation gifts. We have also hired Katie as our Student Success Coordinator to provide academic support through tutoring, advocacy, and creating culturally relevant spaces and programming on Campus at Yukon University in Dawson. Our Elder's on Campus program is now running which includes involvement in academic programs, and drop-in activities every Tuesday and Thursday, 1-3pm.

Together, our new team coordinated a Career Fair at Robert Service School for youth and community members on October 9-10. Over 30 exhibitors from a wide employment sector participated by promoting career options to attendees. Over 100 people were engaged in conversation, games, construction site tours, truck driving simulator experience, handson esthetics demos and more. The feedback from everyone was very positive and we look forward to building momentum for the next one.
