





Special Feature

Reconnecting Through Language

AOC Hän Language Teacher Tr'ënin Tsul (Erika Scheffen) received a special gift recently from linguist and language teacher John Ritter: a beautiful bag made by her great grandmother, Annie Henry!

John recieved the bag from Annie in the late 1970s as a mähsį cho for the work he was doing to preserve Yukon languages. When John decided to pass the bag on to Annie's greatgranddaughter, Tr'ënin Tsul he had this to say:

"I met Joe and Annie when they visited FtMcP for the Northern Games in 1975. Became instant friends, visited



in Dawson regularly for decades and especially after opening of the Dempster Highway. Their house was meeting place for EVERYone from McPherson, Old Crow, Eagle, Mayo, etc. Hahaha the sounds of laughter (and Gwich'in language) made a lasting impression! Such a blessing to have known them so long. Annie would be overjoyed to know the bag is nows YOURS!"



John and Tr'ënin Tsul have been working closely together as she studies Hän grammar and helps pass on what she learns to the four students currently enrolled in our Hänlanguage immersion program. John wanted to pass the bag to Tr'ënin Tsul to recognize her courage and bravery in learning her language.

The bag features Annie Henry's beadwork on home-tan leather and has a beautiful

floral lining. Tr'ënin Tsul says she slept with the bag the first night after John gave it to her and felt very close to her great grandmother, who she remembers fondly from childhood. Tr'ënin Tsul father is Terry Scheffen, who is the son of Fanny Henry. Fanny is the daughter of Annie Henry.

If you want to have a close up look at the bag, be sure to track down Tr'ënin Tsul, who will wear it proudly.

Ty Styner, Land and Resources Manager

Ty is a recent arrival to Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in territory, having spent the last 10 years on Vancouver Island. Throughout that time, he was fortunate to work alongside community leaders from Coast Salish, Kwakwaka'wakw, and Nuuchah-nulth First Nations to help manage various land-based projects ranging from traditional clam garden restorations to wildlife trail camera studies, the revitalizing of sea mammal harvests, and many more. In May 2023 he began working as a contractor to support the launch of the Nuu-chah-nulth Youth Warrior Family Society, an Indigenous youth-led non-profit



organization that provides land-based leadership and wellness programs for Nuu-chah-nulth youth and communities. Ty spent also spent several years as the Regional, and then National Coordinator, of the Jane Goodall Institute of Canada's Uncovering Common Ground Program. If you're interested in chatting with Ty, his door is always open!

Tiffany Thomas, Jordan's Principle Coordinator

Tiffany is excited to be a part of the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in team and already feels so welcome. She and her family recently relocated to Dawson, but they are not new to the North.
