Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Government is seeking 2-3 Citizens to sit on a Housing Appeal Board. An Appeal Board is formed when a Citizen wishes to appeal a decision made by the Housing Committee. Decisions made by an Appeal Board are final. Citizens who sit on an Appeal Board must have no arrears within the Housing Department and have no conflict of interest with the Citizen making the appeal. Citizens who sit on an Appeal Board are compensated for their time.

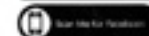
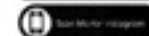

Prepare for Winter

A MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSING AND INFRASTRUCTURE TEAM FOR TH RENTERS



Winter is coming and according to reports it will be a milder and wetter winter, with more snow and more storms. Here are some steps tenants can take to help ensure they have no maintenance problems over winter.

- Please ensure your yard area is tidy and that there are no barriers of access to the fuel tank or electrical meter of your unit.
- Turn off your outside water lines and drain the faucet and line to prevent freezing of the line or spitting of the faucet.
- Turn on your water bleeders on by October 15.
- Ensure your windows and doors close and seal properly, weather stripping is intact, and the lock and latch assemblies work without trouble.
- Check and replace batteries in smoke and co2 detectors and your furnace filters should be checked for replacement. If you need a replacement or would like us to check them for you please call the office.
- Please set HRV (heat recovery ventilator) or humidistat to 30% during the winter to remove the humidity and prevent moisture build-up in your unit, this will prevent icing of windows and doors and stop mold growth.
- If you require assistance with any of your water lines or ventilation, please contact the Housing team and we can come help you. All minor repairs and maintenance of the unit is the responsibility of the tenant. Examples include clogged toilets and drains and minor adjustments to doors, closets etc.



Snow Removal

The tenant is responsible for keeping their walkways, steps, garbage stands, and all access lanes cleared of snow. The Tr'èhudè Crew will be available for clearing the snow for Elders, but we encourage younger family members living with Elders to help with snow removal, as the Tr'èhudè crew may be busy and they only work until December.

Tenant Absence Procedure

Tenants must arrange to have someone reside in or monitor the premises if they are away from the unit for more than 24 hours from October 1 to March 31. Tenants may also have an approved monitoring company check the rental unit to ensure no freeze-up or damages to the unit occur.

A proper check-up must include a flush of all water lines for five minutes minimum; this means ALL TAPS must be turned on for five minutes to ensure the water line and the sewer line is thawed and no blockages are in the lines, as well as flushing the toilet(s). Ideally this should be done twice in 24 hours but once is sufficient to keep water and sewer lines from freezing.

Elders on Campus - September reflections

This September was a special month for our Elders on Campus program, filled with learning, laughter, and meaningful connections.

We Held our very first welcoming ceremony at the Tr'odëk Hätr'unohtän Zho on September 2nd. This was an opportunity to welcome the new SOVA cohort along with students in the community who are doing their online studies. We gathered around the fire for a prayer, smudging and welcoming words from Deputy Chief, Elders on Campus, Yukon U staff and TH Education staff.

We were honoured to welcome Elders and staff from the Whitehorse Campus as well as Lucy Wilson, who traveled down from Fort McPherson to lead a traditional embroidery workshop. The hands-on session brought together participants of all ages to learn stitching techniques, share stories, and connect through traditional art.

We hosted our first online session with citizens studying outside of the Traditional Territory. We will continue to bring our Adult Education and Elders on campus program virtually to students throughout the year, to foster connections to home.

In collaboration with Heritage and the K-12 Education team, we hosted a Digital Storytelling workshop with Jesse Currel at Land of Plenty. Participants had the opportunity to learn how to use digital tools to tell stories rooted in culture, language, lived experience. It was a powerful way to preserve and share knowledge in a modern format. Two citizens were trained up to facilitate this work in the future.

Our Elders on Campus program is excited to introduce Arora Kormendy as the new Elders on Campus host. Arora brings warmth, curiosity, and deep respect for traditional knowledge to her role. She's especially excited about the chance to learn from the Elders and to share time and stories with them. Arora is joined on this journey by her baby, Natsu, who is already making friends among the community.
